Target Announces Significant Expansion

The largest contiguous building in Kershaw County is set to become even bigger. In September, Target Corporation announced a significant expansion to its Lugoff facility. The 1.35 million square foot facility will grow by 450,000 square feet for a total of 1.8 million square feet. When completed, the Lugoff facility will become the largest center within Target's distribution network.

The company plans to invest \$73 million in the building and additional machinery. This expansion is a direct result of the growth of Target stores in the southeast. Currently, the Lugoff facility services 60-74 stores in South Carolina, North Carolina, Florida, Georgia, and parts of Tennessee. When completed, the number stores serviced will reach 100.

Kershaw County Council recently approved an amendment to the company's existing Fee-in-Lieu of Tax (FILOT) agreement. This amendment will allow Target to place the new investment in its current agreement which will reduce the company's future property taxes.

KCMC Breaks Ground on Elgin Facility

On August 27th, officials from Kershaw County Medical Center and Kershaw County came together to celebrate the groundbreaking of the hospital's Elgin facility as well as the grand opening of Wateree Executive Park. KCMC's 42,000 square foot facility is scheduled to be complete in 2009. When finished, the two story complex will house urgent care services and imaging services including MRI, X-Ray, and digital mammography. Cardiology services will also be offered.

The County also celebrated the grand opening of the office park by thanking its many partners on the project including Fairfield Electric Cooperative as a contributor to the land purchase and AT&T for providing and infrastructure grant. Kershaw County purchased the 60-acre property in 2005 and started immediately talking with KCMC about being a tenant in the park. In 2007, Kershaw County Medical Center purchased nine acres in Wateree leading the way for the new facility.

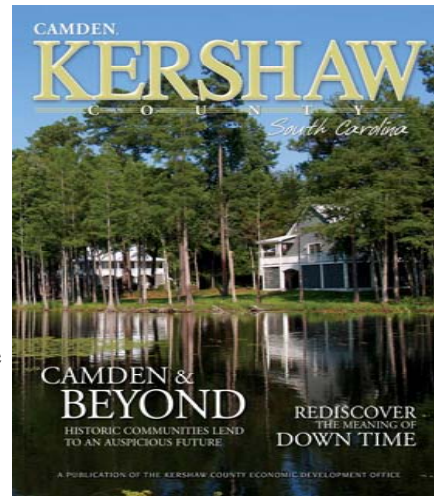
Construction of the Phase I infrastructure is complete including the entrance/ roadway, water and sewer mains, signage and landscaping.
